2025 was an exceptional year for the Livonia Public Library, and we're proud to share some of our highlights!

Our libraries had more than 204,000 visitors during 2025, a 6% increase over 2024. Whether you stopped by to borrow a book, attend a program, find a quiet place to work, or simply say hello, we're happy to continue serving as vibrant community hubs.

Library programs drew in nearly 31,000 attendees across almost 1,000 programs during the year! A major programming highlight was the annual One City One Book event, where over 500 people attended programs relating to local history, life in the midwest and the 2025 title "The All American" by Susie Finkbeiner.

We closed out the year with over 27,500 Livonia Library cardholders, showing just how many residents are taking advantage of all the library has to offer, including 24/7 digital access to an ever growing library of eResources. In just the last year, we've added resources like Mango Languages, which offers instruction in more than 70 world languages, and PressReader, which provides access to thousands of newspapers and magazines from around the world.

Additionally, we launched our mobile app, making it even easier to access library services on the go. Whether you're looking to store your library card digitally, check on your due dates, or register for a program, the app has you covered.

Even our delivery vehicle received a refresh with an eye catching new wrap that makes it easy to spot around town and at community events!

Thank you for being part of another successful year at the Livonia Public Library! We're looking forward to seeing what 2026 brings.



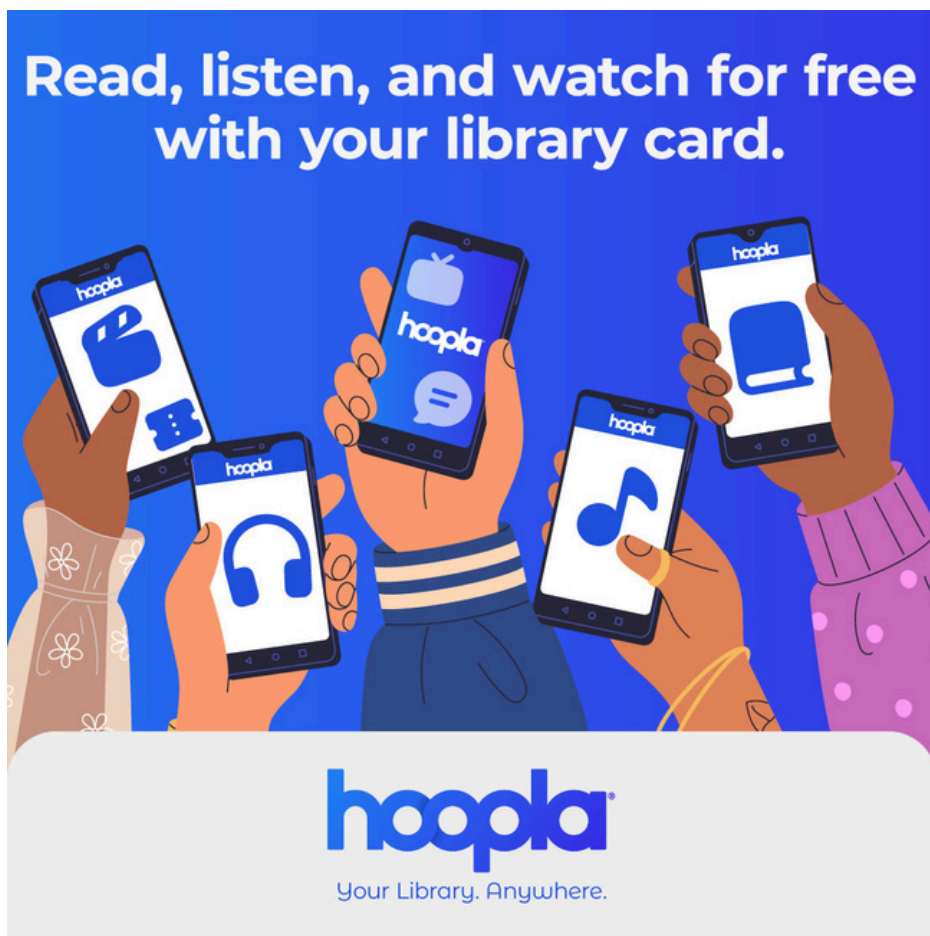

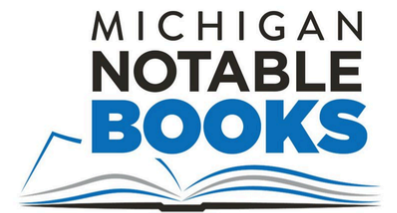
