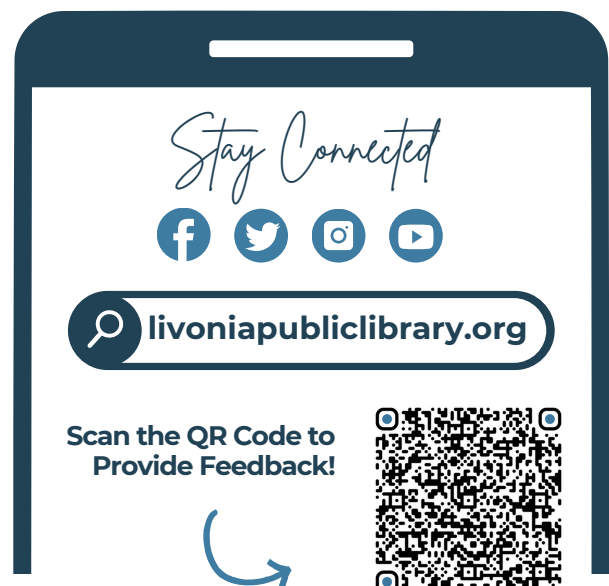

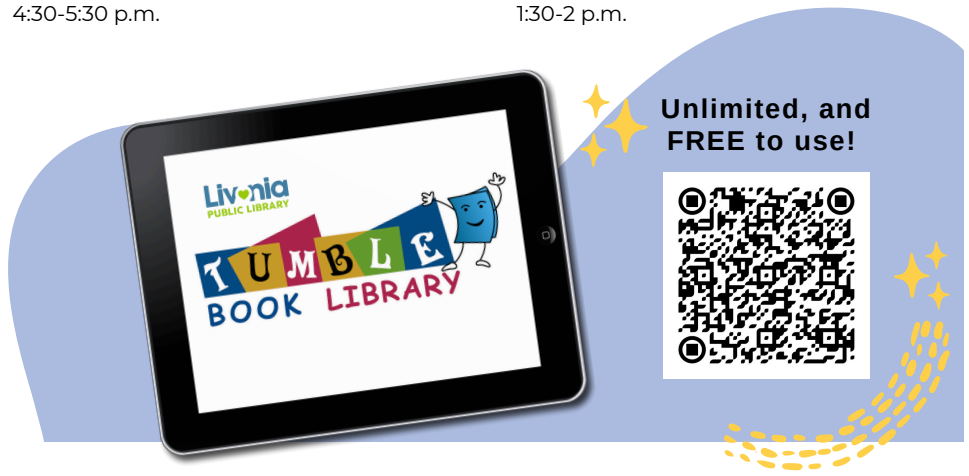

**AMERICA'S FAVORITE HOLIDAY MOVIE: AN INSIDE LOOK AT 'IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE'**

Voted the most inspirational movie ever made by the American Film Institute, Frank Capra's "It's a Wonderful Life" has been a beloved Christmas classic for many generations. 
